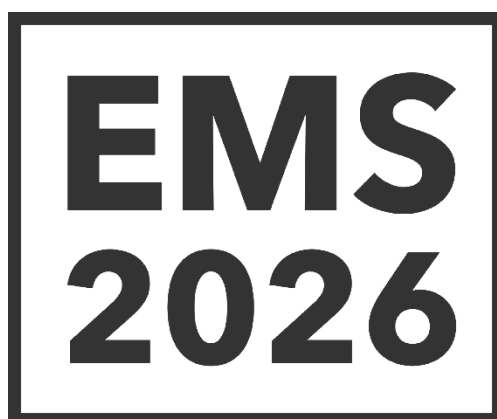

Intro about Comillas:

By bridging scholarly excellence with executive practice, #EMS2026 is designed to amplify ideas that endure - ideas that help leaders build performance **and** purpose, delivering value that lasts well beyond the conference itself.

The EMS 2026 conference is open to diverse research questions posed by researchers that are aimed at different contexts and real-world problems, and that employ diverse methods of inquiry and conceptual frameworks. Research submissions that employ rigorous scientific methods and highly relevant practical findings and applications are strongly encouraged. Please review the following guidelines for preparing a research submission for the EMS 2026 conference:

Original/New Work Rule

- All submitted papers must not have been presented at prior EMS conferences or other academic meetings. However, substantively revised versions of the previously presented work are acceptable.
- At the time of submission, all papers must not have been published or accepted for publication by academic journals or other outlets.
- If a paper is under review for publication in an academic journal, it must NOT appear in pre-print, print, or online before the EMS 2026 conference (July 15th - 18th, 2026).

- Research Papers
- Working Papers (for Poster session)
- Doctoral Consortium
- Panel Proposals
- Workshops
- Consortia Panels

All submissions (research papers, working papers for poster sessions, doctoral consortium submissions, and panel proposals) must be made through the EDBAC submission portal, available at <https://edbac.org/ems2026/submissions> which will be open until **Sunday, April 12, 2026, 11:59 pm** CET. All submissions will be carefully reviewed, and accepted papers, posters, and doctoral consortium submissions are expected to be presented by one or more registered authors for the conference. Maximum 2 submissions allowed.

Please note that all accepted submissions involve a commitment to register and present in-person at the conference, as appropriate for the type of submission. Submissions for which no authors are registered for the conference by the above deadlines will be removed from the program and proceedings.

4.1. RESEARCH PAPER SUBMISSIONS

These submissions represent completed papers or research projects, which can be either conceptual or empirical papers. All submissions will be peer-reviewed and, if accepted, presented in person at the conference, and will appear in the conference proceedings. Submissions to this track are completed research projects of either type:

- **Conceptual Papers:** papers that provide comprehensive and integrative syntheses of research related to engaged management, that develop conceptual frameworks that extend or critically evaluate existing theories or suggest innovative theories.
- **Empirical Papers:** Analysis of empirical data that result in findings of practical and theoretical importance, with a demonstrated influence on management practice. Empirical papers must provide a detailed description of the methodology, data, and results of each study. We encourage authors to summarize their results in a table and use figures, when necessary.

Research paper submissions can adopt any theoretical perspective and methodological approach including quantitative studies, qualitative studies, conceptual papers, research reviews, and so forth. All submissions must provide unique insights to theory and future research as well as offer solutions to important business problems that are practical, evidence-based, and consistent with the mission, aim and scope of engaged scholarship. Submissions should include a brief introduction explaining what the research question is and why it is important and/or interesting to engaged scholarship.

The length of the submissions cannot exceed 8,000 words, not including references, tables, figures, and appendices. For citation and reference style, it is recommended to follow the Academy of Management Journal style (see <https://aom.org/docs/default-source/events/amjstyleguide.aspx>).

Reviewing will be blind. Evaluation will be based on a) how important and/or interesting the research is to the Engaged Management audience; b) quality of the research; c) coherence and readability; d) completeness of the research. Please adhere to high standards of spelling and grammar and consider having a copyeditor or peer review the paper prior to submission.

Papers will be grouped into themes for the different sessions. Sessions will have a duration of 1 hour and 30 minutes. Each session will have a discussant (the moderator).

Please note that you cannot submit the same paper to a poster track.

4.2. POSTER PAPER SUBMISSIONS

These submissions are **work-in-progress** research projects or research proposals that will be reviewed and approved in advance by a select editorial board chosen by the Poster Session Chairs. Since the **work-in-progress** papers or research proposals may not have any collected data or results at the time of the submission, they will be judged on the merit of the research idea, study plan, and potential implications for research and practice. If the preliminary results of the study are available, it is recommended to briefly summarize them.

Submission Instructions - *submissions consist of a 3-page extended abstract that addresses:*

- Double-spaced, font size 12.
- Problems addressed, aims, and research question(s).
- Justification for why and to whom the research is important.
- Theoretical basis for the work.
- Research design.
- Information about data sample and preliminary results, if any.
- Presentation of findings (if applicable at that stage).
- Discussion of the relevance and/or practical importance of the study.
- References (not part of 3 pages)

Please note that the submission to this track is a 3-page extended abstract for a working paper or research proposal, not the poster itself. If and when accepted to the Poster session, the author(s) will receive a PowerPoint poster template with the right size requirement to be filled out. Below are some preliminaries of the poster requirements so applicants can envision what they will have to submit.

Guidelines for the Poster Format

We ask that you design your poster thoughtfully in a way that allows readers to easily grasp your research:

- Include **your full name** and **the title** of the paper.
- Use simple, direct language that is easy for readers to understand.
- Use a large font that is easy to read from a few feet away and aim for visual impact.
- Prioritize information. It is most important for readers to walk away knowing the key takeaways from your research.

Include the following:

- Problems addressed, aims, and research question(s).
- Justification for why and to whom the research is important.
- Theoretical basis for the work.
- Research design.
- Intended data sample.
- Findings (if applicable at that stage).
- Discussion of the relevance and/or practical importance of the study.
- References.

4.3. DOCTORAL CONSORTIUM SUBMISSIONS – EDBAC MEMBERS ONLY

The Doctoral Consortium is an excellent opportunity for executive doctoral students working on their dissertation research to share and develop their research and careers with expert review and feedback from peers and faculty facilitators who have been invited from across EDBAC institutions by the Doctoral Consortium Chair.

Corresponding with our “**Bright Ideas, Lasting Impact**” conference theme, sessions will address all phases of the scholar-practitioner journey, from dissertation completion through to effective dissemination, increasing the impact of research, as well as career opportunities post-dissertation.

A highlight of the Consortium is the Round Table Sessions, in which small groups of students and faculty will gather to discuss each Table member’s dissertation. Table assignments will be made in advance, and each Table member’s submission will be distributed to all of those at their Table prior to the conference to facilitate advanced preparation and generative discussion.

Format and criteria for submission

DBA students in their second year of the program and beyond can submit to the Doctoral Consortium. The submission consists of a 3-page extended abstract of the dissertation proposal, including the following:

- Problems addressed, aims, and research question(s).
- Literature review and theoretical foundation.
- Proposed methodology and justification for the research design.
- Intended contribution to theory and practice.

Important note: Participation must be in person. All accepted applicants are expected to attend all Consortium activities on Thursday, July 16th, 2026, and to prepare for the Round Table discussions by reading fellow Table members’ abstracts. Upon acceptance to and participation in the Doctoral Consortium, abstracts will be included in the conference proceedings.

Doctoral Consortium applicants are also encouraged to apply to the Poster session so that the broader conference attendees can provide additional feedback. Even if the same extended abstract of the dissertation proposal is used to apply to both the consortium and poster session, two separate submissions must be made.

4.4. PANELS, WORKSHOPS, AND CONSORTIA SUBMISSIONS

Panels and Workshops will be sessions on relevant topics to Engaged Scholarship and DBA programs, faculty, students, and alumni. Panels (including alumni consortium panels) aim to present ideas and engage the audience in discussion. Workshops are usually offered by faculty, staff, or alumni who share knowledge of a given research topic or practice and can be interactive.

Submissions should include:

- Panel or Workshop
- Title
- Brief description (4-5 sentences)
- Name of the Chair and email address
- Panel participant names, university affiliation, and email addresses
